Uniform Standards

The summer term commences for all pupils on Monday 19th April, so the summer uniform can be worn. I appreciate that purchasing and maintaining uniform has been a challenge during lockdown but in preparation for the new term, I wanted to remind families of some of our school standards regarding uniform and ask families to prepare now to ensure that the correct uniform is ready for the summer term.

Footwear: In all year groups, footwear is expected to be smart, functional and flat and should be black in colour. No pupils are permitted to wear trainers or pumps, unless for a PE lesson, sandals or boots. Please make sure this rule is adhered to when making new purchases.

Socks/tights: Plain grey/black tights or plain white/grey socks can be worn. Please note leggings are not permitted to be worn.

Haircuts: No pupil should arrive at school with an extreme haircut. Shaved patterns, lines and colours are not allowed. Hair should be one length and not 'Stepped' or shaved at different levels.

Jewellery: For safety reasons, pupils are not allowed to wear jewellery, except for a small gold stud in each ear.

Uniform:

Boys:

- Red 'St. Joseph's' polo shirt with school logo
- Red 'St. Joseph's' sweatshirt with school logo
- Plain grey/black trousers or shorts

Girls:

- White 'St. Joseph's' blouse with school logo
- Red 'St. Joseph's' cardigan with school logo
- Plain grey/black skirt, trousers or pinafore dress
- During the summer, girls may wear summer dresses of red gingham

The purpose of all our uniform rules is to ensure fairness amongst pupils and create a smart, professional appearance of our school in the community. Please help to ensure a positive start to the half term by ensuring all uniform rules are adhered to in advance. The support of our parents in maintaining high standards is much appreciated.
