Dear Parents/Carers,

I am writing to remind you of a few school rules regarding uniform and health and safety.

As you know, we have a School uniform policy, which is in place for the following reasons:

- School uniform gives children a sense of pride, community and 'belonging' in the school
- It is practical and smart;
- It allows all children to feel equal in terms of appearance;
- It is designed with health and safety in mind.

Our school uniform is as follows:

Boys

- Plain grey/black Trousers
- Red Polo Shirt with school logo
- Red Sweatshirt with school logo
- Sensible black shoes (Not boots or trainers)

Girls

- Plain grey/black skirt, trousers or pinafore dress - **leggings are not allowed**
- White Blouse with school logo
- Red Cardigan with school logo
- Sensible, flat black shoes (Not boots or trainers)
- Plain grey/black tights or plain white/grey socks

During the summer, girls may wear summer dresses of red gingham.

Footwear

All children should wear closed-toe, sensible flat black shoes for school.
Boots, trainers, sandals and heeled shoes are not allowed in school.

Jewellery

No jewellery is permitted in school except for one small pair of stud earrings (no hoops) and/or a small analogue wristwatch (for KS2 children).

Earrings	✓	One small pair of stud earrings (no hoops). <i>Please note that these have to be removed when children go swimming or have P.E. lessons. If children cannot remove them independently, please ensure that they are not worn on PE or swimming days.</i>
Watches	✓	Inexpensive analogue watches may be worn in Key Stage 2. <i>Please note that these have to be removed when children go swimming or have P.E. lessons.</i>
Smart Watches	✗	Smart Watches and watches that could be disruptive in class must not be worn for school
Necklaces	✗	No necklaces, chains or pendants of any kind are allowed in school. This includes crosses and religious jewellery as it is for reasons of health and safety
Bracelets/ wristbands	✗	No bracelets or wristbands of any kind are allowed in school

Hair

Boys	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No lines, patterns, skin fades or logos shaved into their hair • Hair should not be excessively short (beyond a grade 2), or unnaturally coloured. The back and sides must be blended with the top, to avoid an extreme 'step' or contrast. No artificial colours • No exaggerated, gelled or shaved designs like "Mohicans"
Girls	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No artificial colours • No over-sized bows or flowers are allowed in school • No beads in the hair of any kind are allowed in school <p>We advise children with long hair to always have their hair tied back (to prevent the spread of head-lice) and away from their eyes in order that they can see clearly at all times</p>

We will be monitoring uniform closely next term and children will be asked to remove any items that are not allowed in school. In the event that they are unable to, we will contact you to remove them or collect the items from school. Many thanks for your understanding and support with this.
