Sharing Books with Your Child

Your child will bring home a reading book from school for home reading. Here are some hints to make this an enjoyable experience for your child:

- •Choose a time when you can be relaxed and give your child your full attention
- Praise what your child can do, no matter how small an achievement build up their confidence at every chance
- •Make it enjoyable for both of you; enjoying the book is just as important as getting the words right. Even if you think the text is too easy, talk about the story line or characters, or find words with letter patterns in them
- Encourage your child to look at the meaning of what they are reading and to make a sensible guess at an unknown word, using pictures, letter sounds and the rest of the sentence as clues.
