# After-School Clubs

The next round of Afterschool Clubs will start during the first week back after half term and will change over. Tuesday Art Club will now be for Years 5/6 and will run for 6 weeks and Thursday Multi-skills will be for Years 3/4 and will run for 5 weeks. You will need to sign up at the office and pay for the full 5 or 6 week's sessions when booking your child's place.

Places will be given on a first-come, first-served basis and will not be held. Bookings will open on Monday and the **half-term must be paid in full to reserve your place**. In the event of your child being absent from school on the day of the club, the credit will be rolled over to the next term. No refunds will be given for missing clubs for any other reason, as there were children regularly not attending last year when others were waiting for places.
