Backpacks








A big thank you to all of the Reception parents who came to school this week to learn about supporting children with phonics.

Dear Parents / Carers,

Book bags, not Backpacks

Thank you to those parents, who informed us about delays with the ordering and delivery of new book bags at the start of September. We hope you appreciate the grace period school offered with allowing backpacks, whilst orders were processing. Most of these orders have now been completed and delivered. However, there are still a lot of children coming to school each day with a backpack rather than a school book bag.

Backpacks have not been permitted in school for a number of years now, as unfortunately, we do not have room to store them in our cloakroom areas and they can be a hazard, especially in corridors and near to the stairs. As I am sure you would agree, we want to make sure that everyone in school is kept as safe as possible.

From Monday 2nd October, please ensure that your child only brings a book bag to school (<u>no more backpacks</u>), which will be more than adequate enough to carry their reading book(s) and homework diary. Any lunch boxes can be carried separately, as these are put into a storage box as soon as the children enter school.

Coats and Umbrellas

As you know, the British weather tends to be very wet and now that we are entering Autumn, the weather is likely to get wetter and also colder. Please make sure that children are wearing their coats, which should be suitable for wet and cold weather.

If your child travels to school with an umbrella on a wet morning, you will need to take their umbrellas back with you. We are not able to store these in school, as we do not have room and they cause a lot problems with water dripping on to surfaces. If umbrellas do come into school, they will be put in the foyer, outside the main office, for you to collect at the end of the day.

Uniform and PE kit

Please see below some reminders about uniform and PE kits, which we have seen in school recently:
As with book bags, some parents have previously advised that they were having difficulties with buying school PE pumps.

Any children that have been wearing normal trainers for their PE lessons, should now have the correct PE pumps.

Children wearing bottoms for PE should only wear

- plain black / grey tracksuit bottoms.
- <u>Leggings / Lycra type bottoms are not permitted.</u>
- Please do not send children in tracksuit tops / jackets. Pupils should wear their normal school jumper or cardigan over their PE top, which they can remove if they need to.

Leggings should not be worn as part of normal school uniform either in place of trousers or under a skirt.
