





Dear Parents, Carers, Pupils, Staff and Parishioners,



This Sunday is the First Sunday of Advent. The word 'advent' comes from the Latin word 'adventus', which means "arrival". It is the traditional time of spiritual preparation and waiting for the arrival of the coming of Jesus to earth when he was born as a baby at Bethlehem about two thousand years ago.

What is Advent?

Advent is the beginning of the Church's Year and starts four Sundays before Christmas Day (25 December). It is a time of preparation during which we get ready to celebrate the birth of Jesus. It is also a time when we concentrate on our belief that Christ will come again and how we should prepare ourselves for this. Thus we reflect upon how we live our lives and we seek forgiveness through the Sacrament of Reconciliation which enables us to start afresh. Purple is the colour used during this season and the priest's vestments are of this colour.

There are many traditions that form part of Advent and preparation for Christmas. One of these, which we use in school, is the Advent Wreath. The wreath is made of a circle of evergreen branches, which symbolise eternal life, as the circle has no beginning or end. The wreath holds three purple candles and one pink candle, to represent the four Sundays of Advent, and a white candle in the centre. A purple candle is lit on the first, second and fourth Sundays of Advent. On the third Sunday we light the pink candle to remind us that we are getting near to Christmas. Purple is a colour that represents waiting and penitence, and is also a 'royal' colour. The white candle (which represents Christ) is lit on Christmas Day.

In school, we have an Advent wreath in each classroom; the candles will be lit each day at prayer time.
