It is lovely to see that so many parents have redeemed them already! Please ensure that you do this before 11<sup>th</sup> March, as you will not be able to redeem them after this date.

### After-school Clubs – Spring 2

If your child has been attending either Multiskills for Y3/4 or Art for Y2 over this half-term they will continue to attend after half-term holiday. Clubs will run from Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> February until the week ending 22<sup>nd</sup> March (the week BEFORE we break up). # Summer Term trips

World Book Day takes place in school on 7<sup>th</sup> March and to celebrate this we are holding a 'Book Week' in school. Children will be encouraged to talk about their favourite authors and books (and maybe bring them into school to share) and will take part in activities and lessons based around books. It is going to be a very exciting week in school, which we are all looking forward to.

Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March will also be 'Book Character' dressing up day, where children (and staff!) can come into school dressed as their favourite book character. You will receive a letter about this after the holiday, but remember costumes don't have to cost a lot of money. Why not think about making your own costume? Or using items of clothing you may already have to make a costume.



# Measles Update

The measles outbreak in Birmingham is now getting closer with outbreaks locally. A large proportion of cases are children under the age of 10 and 50% of cases in Birmingham have had to be hospitalised. As we informed you last week **unvaccinated individuals who live in the same household or who come into close contact with a measles case will not be allowed to go to school or work for 21 days**. It is vital that your children are vaccinated for their health, the health of the community and the good of their education.

Please note, individuals who have received one of the two MMR injections can go to school or work even if they are a close contact. However, one injection is only effective in 95% of cases, whereas two doses gives immunity for life. If you or your child is unvaccinated or has only had one MMR injection it's important that you contact your GP and book an appointment.
