# Feedback from RE Parent Questionnaire March 2024

Here are the responses from the five questions....

- Q1: The school enables my child to behave respectfully 97% of respondents feel that the school enables their child to behave respectfully.
- Q2: Staff at this school are positive role models for my child 93% of respondents feel that the staff are a positive role model.
- Q3: I understand the school's Catholic mission and I am supportive of it. 95% of respondents understand the schools Catholic mission and are supportive of it.
- Q4: My child enjoys learning in RE lessons. 90% of respondents stated that their child enjoys learning RE.
- **Q5: I would like to be more involved in the prayer life of the school. -** 65% of respondents stated that they would like to be more involved in the prayer in school.
