Changes to the School Day

Safeguarding – Road Safety

Please can I ask that parents remain vigilant of where their children are at all times during drop off and collection. A few weeks ago, we had another incident where a child had run into the road and was almost hit by an oncoming vehicle. Once children have been dismissed, they are in the care and responsibility of the adult that collects them and should have a parent with them at all times, particularly younger children and those who do not attend here. Unfortunately, our road is very busy, particularly when school is opening and closing, and is also a bus route. This is why we also ask you to respect the laws regarding parking on the zigzag lines. They are there for the safety of our children and to ensure that the road and visibility of the road remains clear.

Penalty Notice Fines for Holidays / Attendance are changing

Please note that the rules for attendance will be changing from September 2024. Any days of absences that are unauthorised (this also includes 'late after registration' marks where a child arrives after 9.15am) will now count towards number of absences. Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for term time leave of 5 or more consecutive days, or less days if you have had previous unauthorised absence in the 10 weeks prior to the holiday.

Penalty Notice Fines will also be considered when there have **been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period.** You do not have to be on holiday to be fined. You can have sessions of other unauthorised absence, for example keeping a child off school as you thought it was a teacher day and it wasn't, going shopping, birthdays, waiting in for people to attend your property – these are not authorised reasons to miss school.

Similarly, if we do not hear from you when your child is absent or you do not answer a call from us, and we have a reason for their absence, it will be marked as unauthorised. School does not have to authorise medical absence. If a child is repeatedly absent for minor 'medical issues' we will require you to bring in evidence of illness such as an appointment card from a doctor.

From September, penalty notice fines are issued to each parent of £160 (reduced to £80 if paid within 28 days) for each child that was absent. For example, if you have 3 children absent for term time leave, this would result in each parent receiving a fine of £480 (reduced to £240 if paid within 28 days).

Please bear this in mind when you are booking travel arrangements for the summer holidays. Any children who are not back in school on time will be fined if they fit into the categories above.
