Well done to everyone that took part.




Collaboration between Two MAC Schools Sparks Joy of Science for Students!

Cyber Attack Simulation Day



Last week saw our inaugural Cyber Attack Simulation Day sessions, taking place at Holy Trinty Catholic School in Small Heath. Our schools are accustomed to preparing for various disasters, from fires to lockdowns, but this was our first chance to gather everyone together as an Academy to go through our joint response if we were unfortunate enough to experience a cyber-attack, something that is sadly becoming increasingly common in the education sector and particularly in schools – statistically speaking schools are much more likely to suffer a cyber-attack incident than a fire, and it's vital to look at the risks and the impact this would have on all our schools while trying to continue to operate in difficult circumstances.

Day 1 saw our Primary schools put their plans to the test, with our Secondary schools on Day 2. All schools were represented, and groups initially worked through what staff would do and teach on the first day of an attack, for a period of days and then moved onto the simulation of an incident, starting with the assembly of the cyber response team. A range of topics were covered in varying scenarios such as communication, safeguarding, site access, catering & external bodies that would need to be informed and collaborated with. It was a very constructive day and valuable insight was gained on all fronts, with everyone ending the day with some new knowledge, key takeaways and areas to build upon, adapt and improve.







Thank you to all who attended and for such valuable contributions which made these sessions a great success. Also, a huge thanks to those involved in organising the day, particularly Holy Trinity for being wonderful hosts and allowing our groups to use their facilities for over the two days. We are already looking forward to planning and running our next session in the new Academic year!




Extra-curriculum & Enrichment
