Y6 Secondary Transfer Applications for September 2025

All children in Year 6 should have received a letter before the holiday with details on how to apply for a secondary school place for September 2025. Applications for a secondary school place starting September 2025 can be made between 12 September and 31 October 2024. You are less likely to get a place at one of your preferred schools if you apply late. Secondary Transfer preferences for school places must be submitted to the city council **by Tuesday 31**st **October 2024**. Please ensure that you have applied for places by then, as late applications are less likely to get the school of their choice.

Wraparound Childcare Parent Survey

The Local Authority is rolling out a parent survey using the BEHEARD platform requesting feedback on its current and future requirements for wraparound childcare. The survey is targeting those parents and carers specifically with primary school age children.

The expectation is that the survey results will help shape and support wraparound childcare for primary school age children in Birmingham to meet the needs of children, parents, carers and families. The survey is open now and will close on Sunday 20th October 2024. You can access the survey by scanning this QR code.



Penalty Notice fines for holidays / poor attendance



Please note that the rules for attendance have changed from September 2024. Any days of absences that are unauthorised (this also includes 'late after registration' marks where a child arrives after 9.15am) will now count towards number of absences. Penalty Notice fines will be issued for term time leave of 5 or more consecutive days, or less days if you have had previous unauthorised absence in the 10 weeks prior to the holiday. The fine for unauthorised holiday is now £160 for each parent (reduced to £80 if paid within 28 days) for each child that was absent. For example, if you have 3 children absent for term time leave, this would

result in each parent receiving a fine of £480 (reduced to £240 if paid within 28 days).

Please bear this in mind when you are booking travel arrangements for the school holidays. Any children who are not back in school on time will be fined if they fit into the categories above. Medical absences either side of school holidays will require evidence of illness to be produced.

Lunch-time Award

Our weekly lunchtime reward system is open to all children, to earn a reward certificate for good behaviour during lunchtimes. Children will be chosen each week and will receive their certificate in assembly and be mentioned in the newsletter.










Year One also enjoyed Super Science Day, they learnt about their 5 senses. They enjoyed trying slices of lemon, salt & vinegar crisps and chocolate.





Year Two had a great time investigating how animals are adapted to their environment during Super Science Day.




