Childs name on School Uniform

Most children within the class will have the same size clothes and it is impossible to tell them alpart without them being labelled. Please be aware that the school is unable to replace lost uniform.



Starting School - Reception 2025

If you have a child that was born between 01-09-2020 and 31-08-2021, online application will open on 1st October on the Birmingham City Council website for Reception school places for September 2025. Preferences for school places must be submitted to the city council by **15**th **January 2025**. Please ensure that



you have applied for places by then, as late applications are less likely to get the school of their choice

Y6 Secondary Transfer Applications for September 2025

All children in Year 6 should have received a letter before the holiday with details on how to apply for a secondary school place for September 2025. Applications for a secondary school place starting September 2025 can be made between 12 September and 31 October 2024. You are less likely to get a place at one of your preferred schools if you apply late. Secondary Transfer preferences for school places must be submitted to the city council **by Tuesday 31**st October 2024. Please ensure that you have applied for places by then, as late applications are less likely to get the school of their choice.

Penalty Notice fines for holidays / poor attendance



Please note that the rules for attendance have changed from September 2024. Any days of absences that are unauthorised (this also includes 'late after registration' marks where a child arrives after 9.15am) will now count towards number of absences. Penalty Notice fines will be issued for term time leave of 5 or more consecutive days, or less days if you have had previous unauthorised absence in the 10 weeks prior to the holiday. The fine for unauthorised holiday is now £160 for each parent (reduced to £80 if paid within 28 days) for each child that was absent. For example, if you have 3 children absent for term time leave, this would

result in each parent receiving a fine of £480 (reduced to £240 if paid within 28 days).

Please bear this in mind when you are booking travel arrangements for the school holidays. Any children who are not back in school on time will be fined if they fit into the categories above. Medical absences either side of school holidays will require evidence of illness for them to be authorised.

Lunch-time Award

Our weekly lunchtime reward system is open to all children, to earn a reward certificate for good behaviour during lunchtimes. Children will be chosen each week and will receive their certificate in assembly and be mentioned in the newsletter.
