The children lead the Liturgy, and they work hard to prepare their readings each week. If you have never been to one of our Masses, why not come along? You are all welcome to attend and you do not have to be Catholic to come to Mass.

Birthday Celebreations / Party Bags

It is always lovely to see children wanting to share birthday treats with their class. Please can we ask that if you are sending in any sweets or chocolates to share, that you check they do not contain any nuts. Sweets such as Celebrations, Quality Street and Roses often have sweets that have nuts inside, and bars such as Snickers which contain peanuts. We have some children with severe nut allergies, and this can be very dangerous for them. If your child does bring home birthday sweets, please check that the contents are suitable for their diet before allowing them to eat them. Many thanks for your understanding with this.

Starting School - Reception 2026

If you have a child that was born between 01-09-2021 and 31-08-2022, online applications are now open on the Birmingham City Council website for Reception school places for September 2026. Preferences for school places must be submitted to the city council by **15**th **January 2026**. Please ensure that you have applied for places by then, as late applications are less likely to get the school of their choice.



Y6 Secondary Transfer Applications for September 2026

Online applications for Year 7 in September 2026 opened on 1 September 2025. Parents and carers who live in Birmingham should apply via the Birmingham City Council website by the deadline of 31st October 2025. Full details, including admission arrangements and guidance to help parents with making preferences, are available on our website. Year 7 admissions – September 2026 – St Paul's School for Girls

If you are applying to St Paul's School for Girls for a Year 7 place in September, you will need to apply through the Local Authority online and also complete a Supplementary Information Form. If your child is Catholic, you need to send a copy of their baptism certificate and a certificate of Catholic Practice that the Parish Priest will need to complete. All forms need to be sent directly to St Paul's School for Girls.

Parking

Over recent weeks it has been noted that a number of parents are stopping/parking on the zig-zag line markings on the road (outside school). The zig-zags mean that you cannot stop or park there for any length of time, even to drop off children and it is also an offence. The road markings are there for the protection of your families, so please be mindful of this.

Medical Emergencies/illnesses

To keep your child safe, it is important that we know of any medical issues that may affect them in school. We also need to make sure that we have accurate and up-to-date medical information in the event of your child becoming ill at school. Please make sure that you let us know of any changes or updates in your child's health.

Please can we also ask that if your child has had any medical emergency at home, especially those that have required hospital admission or treatment, that you let school know about this as soon as possible.

New 24/7 Mental Health Text Service for Birmingham and Solihull

A new mental health text service is now available for people of all ages across Birmingham and Solihull. The service is free, confidential, and available 24/7 – offering support at the touch of a button.

Text 'Space' to 85258 to connect with a trained mental health professional.

Whether you're feeling anxious, stressed, low, or overwhelmed, help is just a text away. This service is especially helpful for those who may find it difficult to talk on the phone or in person. Launched in partnership between **Birmingham and Solihull Mental Health NHS Foundation Trust** and **Shout**, the UK's first 24/7 text messaging support service, this initiative aims to make mental health support more accessible to everyone. In addition to immediate support, texters can be signposted to local services such as Talking Therapies, Crisis Cafés and NHS 111

Option 2. This new digital service offers a safe space to talk and is a valuable resource for anyone seeking early help or waiting for further support.

National Burn Awareness Day 2025

National Burn Awareness Day is taking place on 15th October 2025, the aim of the day is to raise awareness of the causes of burn and scald injuries in the UK and to reduce the number occurring each year by providing the right advice on the First Aid treatment should a burn injury occur to minimise the long-term impact. 
