

Starting School - Reception 2026 – apply now!

If you have a child that was born between 01-09-2021 and 31-08-2022, online applications are now open on the Birmingham City Council website for Reception

school places for September 2026. Preferences for school places must be submitted to the city council by **15**th **January 2026**. Please ensure that you have applied for places by then, as late applications are

less likely to get the school of their choice.

There are more than 40,000 out-of-hospital cardiac arrests every year in the UK, but less than 1 in 10 people survive.

Every minute without CPR and defibrillation reduces the chance of survival by up to 10%.

That's why we've registered our defib and regularly update its status on The Circuit, the national defibrillator network. This means the ambulance service can find it and trust it's ready to use in an emergency.

If a defib is not registered the ambulance service won't know it exists, and the opportunity to help save a life could be missed.

Medical Emergencies/illnesses

To keep your child safe, it is important that we know of any medical issues that may affect them in school. We also need to make sure that we have accurate and up-to-date medical information in the event of your child becoming ill at school. Please make sure that you let us know of any changes or updates in your child's health.

Please can we also ask that if your child has had any medical emergency at home, especially those that have required hospital admission or treatment, that you let school know about this as soon as possible.

Is my child too ill for school?

As winter approaches, the NHS have published <u>guidance</u> to help parents assess when a child may be too ill for school. Pupils shouldn't miss school on a precautionary basis and can normally attend with a mild cough or cold, unless they have a fever or diarrhoea or vomiting.



New 24/7 Mental Health Text Service for Birmingham and Solihull

A new mental health text service is now available for people of all ages across Birmingham and Solihull. The service is free, confidential, and available 24/7 – offering support at the touch of a button.

Text 'Space' to 85258 to connect with a trained mental health professional.

Whether you're feeling anxious, stressed, low, or overwhelmed, help is just a text away. This service is especially helpful for those who may find it difficult to talk on the phone or in person. Launched in partnership between **Birmingham and Solihull Mental Health NHS Foundation Trust** and **Shout**, the UK's first 24/7 text messaging support service, this initiative aims to make mental health support more accessible to everyone. In addition to immediate support, texters can be signposted to local services such as Talking Therapies, Crisis Cafés and NHS 111 Option 2. This new digital service offers a safe space to talk and is a valuable resource for anyone seeking early help or waiting for further support.

Measles (MMR) and Winter Immunisations Reminder

The October half term is the perfect time to ensure your child is protected against measles through the MMR (measles, mumps and rubella) immunisation. Measles is a highly infectious disease, which can be very serious. There have been recent cases of measles in Birmingham and most of these cases are in young children who have not had their MMR

immunisation. You need two doses of the MMR immunisation to get the best protection against measles, children should have their first dose at 1 year old, and their second dose before starting school.

The MMR immunisation is safe for every faith. There is a type of MMR immunisation that does not contain pork gelatine, so it can be used for people who avoid pork products. This immunisation is available at every GP practice, and it is free. If you or your child are not up to date with your MMR immunisations, please contact your GP practice to book an appointment.

Ahead of winter and the festive season, it is also important to protect against illnesses like flu and Covid-19. Free immunisations are available for those most at risk of becoming unwell. Check the NHS website to see if you're eligible and book your appointment.

SHINE@Nechells POD – Tesco Stronger Starts

SHINE@Nechells POD has been shortlisted for the Tesco Stronger Starts vote. This means that from October 2025 to January 2026, the community can help the POD to secure up to £1500 in funding by voting in local Tesco stores (Erdington Six Way Express, B23 7NR and Aston Lane Superstore, B6 6QR). How to vote:

- 1. Shop at one of the above Tesco stores
- 2. Collect a blue token at checkout
- 3. Pop it into the Nechells POD Food Pantry slot

Every token makes a difference and will help the POD to be able to continue supporting the community to provide affordable, quality groceries for families in the B7 area.

Transfer of Bloomsbury Library to Nechells POD

You may be aware that Bloomsbury Library has now been transferred from Birmingham City Council ownership to the Nechells POD. The library has moved from the POD's reception area into a bigger room with a self-service kiosk installed. If you plan to visit the library you will need to take your Birmingham City Council library card and know your four-digit pin in order to access and borrow books from the library. Libraries are a valuable local resource, and we encourage all our families to visit and make use of the resources and facilities!
