Parents Evening

Thank you to the parents who filled in our Parental Questionnaire, we received 61 responses. We have now collated the results and over the next few newsletters we will publish the results.

The results from the first few questions are below:

1. ***My child enjoys school.***

64% strongly agreed, 26% agreed and 10% neither agreed nor disagreed

So overall, all of the responses were positive regarding whether their child enjoys school.

2. ***My child feels safe at school.***

61% strongly agreed, 36% agreed, 2% neither agreed nor disagreed and 2% (1 person) strongly disagreed

So overall, 98% of the responses were positive regarding how safe their child feels in school.

3. ***The school understands my child's needs and responds to them.***

38% strongly agreed, 59% agreed and 3% neither agreed nor disagreed

So overall, all of the responses were positive regarding whether the school understands the needs of the children.

4. ***Behaviour is of a good standard at school.***

46% strongly agreed, 49% agreed and 5% neither agreed nor disagreed

So overall, all of the responses were positive regarding the standard of behaviour in the school.

Family Support Service

Mrs Gowen is running a new family support service in school on a Thursday morning (by appointment only) between 9:00 and 10:30am. Is my child too ill for school?

As winter approaches, the NHS have published [guidance](#) to help parents assess when a child may be too ill for school. Pupils shouldn't miss school on a precautionary basis and can normally attend with a mild cough or cold, unless they have a fever or diarrhoea or vomiting.



NHS Pharmacy First Service

Community Pharmacists can offer free and confidential advice for minor illnesses and if appropriate, they can provide treatment* without a prescription for seven common conditions:

- Urinary tract infection (*women aged 16-64*)
- Sinusitis (*adults and children aged 12+*)
- Sore throat (*adults and children aged 5+*)
- Earache (*children and young adults aged 1-17*)
- Infected insect bite (*adults and children aged 1+*)
- Impetigo (*adults and children aged 1+*)
- Shingles (*adults aged 18+*).
